

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
January 6, 2020**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bradley, Henry, Schneider, Bennett, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Superintendant White, and Secretary Adkins. Circuit Rider Joe Mangini, Attorney Andrew Illuminati, Jean Cordrey, and Nancy Springer were also present.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the December 16th regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell announced the winners of the Holiday Decorating Contest.

Traditional- 1<sup>st</sup>: 107 Ferry Street, 2<sup>nd</sup>: 805 State Street, 3<sup>rd</sup>: 703 State Street

Modern: 1<sup>st</sup>: 717 Main Street, 2<sup>nd</sup>: 601 Railway Street, 3<sup>rd</sup>: 104 Ferry Street

Superintendant White reported the result received from the Acetone testing was insignificant. The low numbers could have been a result of the cleaning chemicals used at the lab. The MDE wastewater inspector came to do an inspection and stated she would be referring us to the compliance department for the ongoing problem. Superintendant White stated he has scheduled a meeting for January 9<sup>th</sup> to discuss the issue.

Circuit Rider Joe Mangini stated the funding documents for the old school grant are not available yet. He stated the next step for 502 Nanticoke Street is to clean the property and contact Operation We Care about the donation. He also stated he is still working on finding a grant for the bulkhead repairs.

President Gosnell stated Kirk Kinnamon needs approval for the monthly cost of the new street lights at Pecan Corner, which the Commissioners agreed to. Superintendant White stated reflectors have been installed around the fire hydrant for better visibility.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

The Commissioners reviewed a request for assistance with the water bill at 605 Nanticoke Street. They had a leak which was repaired. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to issue the standard sewer credit, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

The Commissioners reviewed a letter inviting the Commissioners of Sharptown to attend the Wicomico County Work Sessions.

The Commissioners reviewed a quote from Billy Adkins to replace and upgrade the Clerk/Treasurer and Secretary's computers for the amount of \$1540.00. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the quote for \$1540.00 to replace the two computers, taking the money from the rainy day fund. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell stated the January LESMA meeting will be held in Salisbury on January 16<sup>th</sup>. RSVP to Secretary Adkins if attending.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider stated Parks and Recreation are having sign-ups for an indoor soccer program. Superintendent White stated some of the grass at Cherry Beach has been torn up by cars doing donuts and burnouts. He asked the Commissioners for permission to purchase a larger sign stating the park is closed from dusk until dawn. The Commissioners agreed.

Commissioner Henry stated Planning and Zoning will meet January 28<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Bennett stated the Historical Commission will meet next week.

Superintendent White stated they would work on taking down the Christmas lights as weather permits.

President Gosnell introduced Attorney Andrew Illuminati to the Commissioners. He will be attending the meetings going forward.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. Jean Cordrey stated she read that Wicomico County Board of Appeals will hear a request for a Royal Farms store in Mardela Springs.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:10pm.
