

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
April 2, 2018**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:31p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Schneider, Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Superintendent White, Attorney Leslie, Circuit Rider Joe Mangini, and Secretary Adkins. Commissioner Bradley was absent. Resident Jean Cordrey was also present.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the March 19<sup>th</sup> regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated Delmarva Power had to reschedule the new service installation at the water plant. They are now scheduled to do the installation on April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Construction on the Dollar General is continuing. TK Construction will be running the water line to the store on April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

The intersection paving at Fourth and School Street is complete but we do not have date for when they will apply the slurry, only know it will be when weather gets warmer. Superintendent White stated he looked at a list of County projects and did not see Sharptown on the list. President Gosnell will contact County Roads for clarification.

President Gosnell reminded the Commissioners to RSVP for the ESAM meeting on April 19<sup>th</sup>.

President Gosnell stated he met with the State Highway Administration and visited the corner of Rt. 313 and State Street. He stated they agreed to clear out the ditches for a better view for vehicles leaving the intersection.

President Gosnell reminded the Commissioners the Historical Commission will be hosting a speaker, Terry Crannell, on April 15<sup>th</sup> at the Asbury Church Community Hall.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated that Utility Service has informed the Town that the next time the water tower needs to be painted, it will need to be stripped all the way down and a curtain will need to be used to catch what falls off. This could cost over \$100,000. He has asked Circuit Rider Joe Mangini to start looking for grants that may help cover or offset the cost of this project.

President Gosnell stated he will be asking the County to sweep the streets in the near future.

Circuit Rider Joe Mangini reported on items he has been working on. He discussed a bill proposed at the State Senate to increase the amount of highway user revenue the town receives and three grants opportunities for the Historical Commission building. He stated the Critical Areas Commission is working on an update to the ordinance and would like to have a conference call with the Town to answer a few questions. He stated the Comprehensive Plan is due to be updated this year and that the Planning and Zoning Commission members have preliminarily looked through it and it seems as though the main things that will need to be updated are the charts, maps, tables. He will help assist the Town and MDP with the updates. Mr. Mangini has contacted DNR to see if any help is available to offset the costs of the bulkhead repairs, but he has not heard back yet. And lastly, he attended a block grant workshop. He stated it appears Sharptown is not considered a low income community but he is seeking clarification on that.

Superintendent White stated Water and Sewerage amendment is complete and is expected to be filed by Thursday. Commissioner Henry asked if someone builds a new home in our municipal growth area, are they required to annex into town and hook up to town water and sewer. Superintendent White stated no, they are not required too but if they do want to be on town water and sewer then they will be required to annex into town. Superintendent White stated there was a large dumpster at Cherry Beach and asked if anyone knew what it was for, but no one did.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. There were none.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. There were none

Commissioner Henry made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:00pm.
