

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
June 4, 2018**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Superintendent White, Joe Mangini, Roscoe Leslie, 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt John Alessandrini, Aaron Goller, and residents Jean Cordrey and Nancy Springer. Commissioners Bradley and Schneider were absent.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 21<sup>st</sup> regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Aaron Goller from Davis, Bowen, and Friedel reported on the solar project. AltEnergy is working on the buffer and repairing the grounds around the project. The panels were turned on May 31<sup>st</sup>. The funds from MDE are being released for pay requests 4, 5, and 6.

President Gosnell stated the Dollar General store is open and the Grand Opening will be June 9<sup>th</sup> starting at 8am.

Superintendent White stated TK Construction is making progress on the sewer work on State Street and once complete Terra Firma will do the paving.

President Gosnell stated the bids for the trash removal contract were opened on May 29<sup>th</sup>. We received one bid, from Chesapeake Waste. The bid is for the following amounts: 1<sup>st</sup> year: 43520.40, 2<sup>nd</sup> year: 44708.40, and 3<sup>rd</sup> year 46688.40. Commissioner Henry made a motion to accept the bid from Chesapeake Waste, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

Sharptown will be hosting the June LESMA dinner on June 21<sup>st</sup> at the American Legion. Jerry Fletcher will be catering.

President Gosnell stated the Commissioners held a work session on May 29<sup>th</sup> to discuss the impact fees for Pecan Corner subdivision. The Commissioners reviewed a written request from the Kirk Kinnamon from the Farmers Bank of Willards to use their existing impact fees on lots 6, 8, and 9.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell held the first reading of the Sharptown Budget 2018/2019 Ordinance #92. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider read the Sharptown Budget 2018/2019 Ordinance #92 to the Commissioners. A public hearing will be held before the next regular Commissioners meeting.

President Gosnell asked Joe Mangini, Circuit Rider, for an update. Mr. Mangini stated he had submitted the grant application for the acquisition of 502 Nanticoke Street.

President Gosnell asked 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt. Alessandrini for his report. He stated Deputies have been in the area running radar a few times. He also expressed thanks for the Town's support with the recent loss of Deputy Steve Ray.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. There were none.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. Jean Cordrey asked when the budget public hearing would be held, President Gosnell stated at 7:15pm on June 18<sup>th</sup>.

There were no other comments. Commissioner Henry made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:54pm.
